Community Life Pastor

- Shores ministry staff who is a servant leader of leaders
- Oversees all aspects of community life
- Recruits, trains, launches, and multiplies new life groups, and shepherds life group leaders

Community Life Coach

- A ministry volunteer who is a servant leader of leaders
- Assists in the recruiting, training, launching, and multiplication of new life groups, and the shepherding of life group leaders
- Supports the Community Life Pastor and reports to him on all activities happening in the communities served

Life Group Leader(s)

- Ministry volunteer(s) who love and lead others to follow Christ and S.E.R.V.E. in their community
- Spiritual formation leader(s) and facilitator(s) of life group discussions and Bible study
- Casts vision and recruits people to S.E.R.V.E. as leaders within the life group
- Grows the life group numerically with the goal of multiplying
- Identifies and mentors a life group leader trainee with the Community Life Coach and Community Life Pastor

Hospitality Coordinator

- Coordinates all shared meals for the life group gatherings
- Willing to host life group gatherings in your home and coordinate the location of gatherings in the homes of other willing group members
- Makes sure everyone feels welcome
- Possesses the spiritual gift of hospitality

Prayer and Care Coordinator

- Keeps the life group informed of all prayer requests and praises
- Coordinates hospital visits, meals, childcare, and other needs of families in crisis in the life group
- Possesses the spiritual gift of mercy

Compassion Coordinator

- Builds relationships with compassion ministries in the community
- Coordinates opportunities for the life group to share the love of Jesus by serving in the community

Outreach Coordinator

- Looks for opportunities for the life group to reach out and build relationships with unchurched neighbors and friends in the community
- Possesses the spiritual gift of evangelism and/or a passion for outreach

Recreation and Volunteer Coordinator

- Plans ways for the life group to recreate together
- Plans ways for the life group to volunteer and serve in the community
- Keeps the life group informed of volunteer opportunities at Shores

Administrator

- Maintains the life group roster
- Reports attendance to the church office after each life group gathering

In addition to the above ministry position descriptions, ALL community life leaders, staff and volunteers, must meet the following requirements:

- Member of Atlantic Shores Baptist Church
- Participates in the overall life of the church and in a life group
- A team player that maintains the unity of the body of Christ
- Enthusiastically supports and lives out the mission, vision, and strategy of the church
- In agreement with the ASBC Statement of Faith
- Abides by the Ministry Team Covenant

- 1. Pray!
- 2. Complete Life Group Leader Training
- 3. Connect with your Community Life Coach and identify your target
- 4. Work with the church office to establish your online presence for the life group and create your roster.
- 5. Recruit at least 4 other couples/families as part of your core group and assign leadership responsibilities
- 6. Schedule your life group's "open house" to invite interested people. Work with your Community Life Coach and the Community Life Pastor to promote the launch of your life group through the Shores communication channels.
- 7. Launch!

Appendix 2: 25 Simple Ways to Be Missional in Your Neighborhood

I have found that it is often helpful to have practical ideas to start engaging the people around me. Most of the things on this list are normal, everyday things that many people are already doing. The hope is that we would do these things with Gospel intentionality. This means we do them:

- In the normal rhythms of life pursuing to meet and engage new people
- Prayerfully watching and listening to the Holy Spirit to discern where God is working.
- Looking to boldly, humbly, and contextually proclaim the Gospel in word and deed.

Below is a list of my top 25. Not all of these are for everyone, but hopefully there will be several ideas on the list that God uses to help you engage your neighbors. Would love to hear stories of how you have lived some of these out or other ways you have engaged your neighbors.

- 1. Stay outside in the front yard longer while watering the yard
- 2. Walk your dog regularly around the same time in your neighborhood
- 3. Sit on the front porch and letting kids play in the front yard
- 4. Pass out baked goods (fresh bread, cookies, brownies, etc.)
- 5. Invite neighbors over for dinner
- 6. Attend and participate in HOA functions
- 7. Attend the parties invited to by neighbors

- 8. Do a food drive or coat drive in winter and get neighbors involved
- 9. Have a game night (yard games outside, or board games inside)
- 10. Art swap night bring out what you're tired of and trade with neighbors
- 11. Grow a garden and give out extra produce to neighbors
- 12. Have an Easter egg hunt on your block and invite neighbors use their front yards
- 13. Start a weekly open meal night in your home
- 14. Do a summer BBQ every Friday night and invite others to contribute
- 15. Create a block/ street email and phone contact list for safety
- 16. Host a sports game watching party
- 17. Host a coffee and dessert night
- 18. Organize and host a ladies artistic creation night
- 19. Organize a tasting tour on your street (everyone sets up food and table on front porch)
- 20. Host a movie night and discussion afterwards
- 21. Start a walking/running group in the neighborhood
- 22. Start hosting a play date weekly for other stay at home parents
- 23. Organize a carpool for your neighborhood to help save gas
- 24. Volunteer to coach a local little league sports team
- 25. Have a front yard ice cream party in the summer
